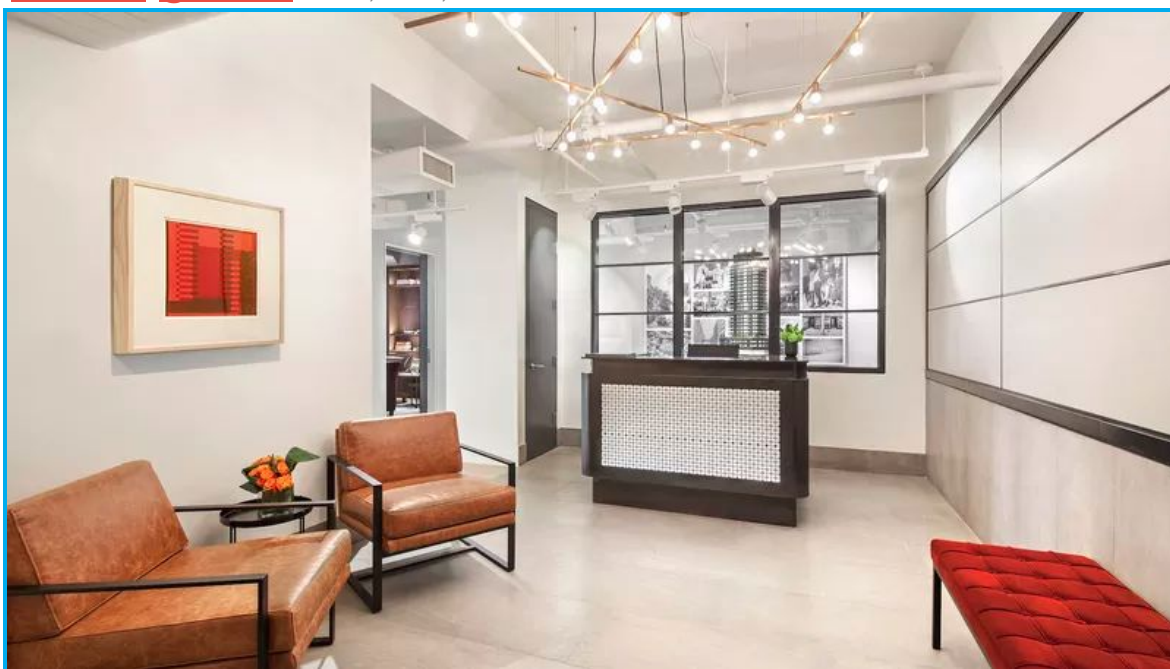




In Nomad, the Bauhaus Movement Inspires a New 55-Unit Condo

In May, sales launched at the NOMA, the latest residential project from



Alchemy Properties, with units in the Bauhaus-inspired building going from \$1.425 million. The developer also recently opened a sales gallery to entice buyers, with one very cool twist: Alchemy partnered with [the Albers Foundation](#), established to honor the legacy of German artist Josef Albers and his wife Anni, to feature artwork, throughout the space. Albers, who's known for his series [Homage to the Square](#), studied at Bauhaus; FXFOWLE, who designed the NOMA, took inspiration from that artistic movement for the building's architecture; and here we are.



The sales gallery includes several rooms that showcase the interiors of the NOMA's 55 units, which include one-, two-, and three-bedroom apartments (though there are currently only one- and two-beds for sale). The clean lines and modern aesthetic of the rooms matches the renderings for the



development quite nicely, and live up to the whole Neo-Bauhaus look that the project is going for.

The sales gallery also has a model of the building that offers a fuller picture of its exterior. Check out more photos below.
